### Freight Forwarding Courses

CBAFF, through its valued partners, delivered the following courses

RACA Compliance training	2-hour on-line course with assessment
IATA Cargo Tariff	3-day course
IATA Aircraft Load and Restraint	½ day course with assessment
IATA Dangerous Goods	5-day Initial course with examination or 3-day recurrent course with examination
Freight Forwarding introduction	1-day course

### Customs focused courses

With our valued partners IVS, CBAFF delivered the following:

UUI (unique user identification) – entry level course comprising 4 blocks of learning with assessments and concludes with an examination.

- Block courses held (127 students x block 1, 104 students x block 2, 92 students x block 3, 95 students x block 4)

Introduction to Customs Broking and Customs Tariff – one-day awareness course - 50 students

### IATA Courses

- Dangerous Goods Initial (5-days) 58 students
- Dangerous Goods Recurrent (3 days) 17 students
- Aircraft Loading and Restraint - 4 students
- Cargo Tariff – 8 students

### Other Freight-focussed courses

- Introduction to Freight Forwarding – one-day awareness course – 7 students
- Regulated Air Cargo Agent Course – 60 students
