## 1. IATA Education & Training Program as ATC

The IATA Diploma international air-cargo training program was launched in 1977 in Japan to meet the growing demand for well-trained staff in air cargo industry. The following qualifications are to be obtained by passing the IATA Diploma examinations.

- ①Air Cargo Introductory course ( I )
- ②Dangerous goods course ( M2 )
- ③Dangerous goods recurrent course ( MR )

JAFA organizes preparatory classroom for each course for the students as well as IATA Cargo Diploma examinations four times a year.

- ①2018 June session in Tokyo,Nagoya and Osaka
- ②2018 September session in Tokyo,Nagoya,Osaka and Fukuoka
- ③2018 December session in Tokyo,Nagoya and Osaka
- ④2019 March Session in Tokyo,Nagoya,Osaka and Fukuoka

## 2. New Employees Air Cargo Training Course
