1. IATA Education & Training Program as ATC

- The IATA Diploma international air-cargo training program was launched in 1977 in Japan to meet the growing demand for well-trained staff in air cargo industry. The following qualifications are to be obtained by passing the IATA Diploma examinations.
 - ① Air Cargo Introductory course (I)
 - ② Dangerous goods course (M2)
 - ③ Dangerous goods recurrent course (MR)

- JAFAs organizes preparatory classroom for each course for the students as well as IATA Cargo Diploma examinations four times a year.
 - ① 2020 March session in Tokyo, Nagoya, Fukuoka and Osaka
 - ② 2020 September session in Tokyo, Nagoya, Fukuoka and Osaka
 - ③ 2020 December session in Tokyo, Nagoya and Osaka

- From May 2021, IATA Diploma exam has shifted to online exams/OERS for cargo introductory course and DG course.

2. New Employees Air Cargo Training Course

- International

- On October 15, 16, 22, and 23, 2020, we held an international air cargo basic course hosted for new employees. It used to be held in May to meet the number



of new employees, but this year it was postponed to October due to the impact of COVID-19. A total of 261 people attended this year, but this year was the first for the association to take online courses amid the Corona disaster, and a total of 185 people took the course online on October 22 and 23.

- Domestic

- On February 19 2021, we held the Domestic air cargo basic course hosted for new employees. A total 49 people took the online course.

3. Dangerous goods handling

- Domestic

- Domestic air cargo dangerous goods handling course was held in January 2021. There were 200 peoples, including 190 online peoples.

4. Security

- The government of Japan designated JAJFA the training agency for air cargo forwarders' employees regarding air cargo security in 2014.

JAJFA, as the training agency, has been operating a training course for air cargo security since 2015, and attendance of the training course was as follows.

107 in2015, 131 in2016, 89 in2017, 105 in 2018, 122 in 2019, 76 in 2020.
