### PROFILE:

ACAAI was founded in 1970 with 16 members, and it currently has a strength of 514 members.

✿ In order to meet the regulatory requirements and to develop job-related skills and expertise, ACAAI encourages and arranges training programmes for the personnel of its members. ACAAI conducts these training programmes in collaboration with authorized and recognized training institutions. The courses which are conducted for this purpose are:

1. Dangerous Goods Regulations (Initial)
2. Dangerous Goods Regulations (Recurrent)
3. Basic Cargo Introductory Course

In addition to the above, ACAAI is also planning to organize GDP [GOOD DISTRIBUTION PRACTICES] and GSP [GOOD STORAGE PRACTICES] trainings which is the need of the hour. All the agents handling pharma and pharma cool chain shipments is required to have a DGP/GSP trained staff so as to ensure the proper handling of cargo and proper deliveries of cargo.

In spite of the pandemic and the prevailing lockdown restrictions in many states in India, ACAAI continues to conduct training programmes successfully on a pan India basis.
